## From the Pastor

Thanks to the generosity of a church family, Dana and I went to a performance of *Jesus Christ Superstar* the week before last, along with other members of our ministerial staff. It was a wonderful production of the show with strong voices and a talented orchestra (including our own Claudia Hinson). And for me, it brought back many memories.

As some of you may recall, seeing a production of this play when I was 15 provoked an interest in the Jesus story. Other factors led me to church and Christian faith, but *Jesus Christ Superstar* played a key role. And oddly enough, I met a man sitting on my row at this performance who had the same experience I had many years ago.

There is just something about the Jesus story, no matter how it is told, that draws people in and provokes reflection. Forty-one years after my first experience with the play, I have stronger opinions about Jesus' life and ministry. I still think the play tells his story in a way that resonates with the Gospel accounts in many ways, but there are things I would add or subtract (like the resurrection on the one hand and the claim that Mary Magdalene was a prostitute on the other). But the play is still powerful because the story is so compelling.

We discovered this again during Holy Week. I'd like to think we worked diligently and prayerfully to structure services that honored Christ, and many of you have offered kind words of affirmation for the planning and leadership involved, but I know that it is the story itself – the story of Jesus' life, death and resurrection – that attracts us and moves and constantly reshapes our lives. In fact, what we seek to do in all of our planning is simply allow the story itself to speak. And it does again and again and again.

But the good news is – it is not over. Easter is not over, we have a whole season to explore the

implications of resurrection, and the larger story of Jesus' life and ministry continues to shape our lives and worship through the year (this is why we follow the Christian calendar). We can't always live with the extreme emotional highs and lows a play like *Jesus Christ Superstar* evokes. Not even all of Jesus' life is about Holy Week. But we can live with a clear sense of purpose every day, an awareness of just how much this one life shapes our own.

I am grateful for the opportunity to have seen the play again. I am grateful for the privilege of helping to retell the story year after year. Most of all, I am grateful for the story itself, the story of God's love for the world. **CC**
