ABOUT OUR WORSHIP: Today is the First Sunday after Christmas, but still part of the Christmas season which concludes with Epiphany on January 6. Thus, we still enjoy the greens in our sanctuary, we still sing Christmas carols and anthems, and we still explore Christmas themes. The sermon is rooted in the reading from Matthew, the Gospel writer's third story in his Christmas trilogy. After presenting a birth narrative which highlights Joseph's role (1:18-25) and the story of magi visiting the Christ Child (2:1-12), Matthew presents the jolting tale of the Holy Family fleeing to Egypt and innocents being slaughtered in and around Bethlehem. It is a jarring transition, but one which provides a needed reminder of how the Jesus story plays out in the real world. The sermon explores this very theme and then we are invited to consider the implications of this story for contemporary discipleship, how we continue the work of Christmas today, knowing there is always resistance to the Spirit of Christ.


