ABOUT OUR WORSHIP: Today is the Seventh Sunday of Easter and the last Sunday before Pentecost. Thus, while each Sunday of the year is a little Easter, we conclude our focused celebration of resurrection and look forward to a recognition of the coming of the Spirit. We begin with the celebration of baptism and end with the commissioning of college students and their chaperones for partnership mission work, thus reflecting the character of Christian life with the structure of our worship - baptism represents new life which leads to service and witness. We continue with readings from Acts, 1 John and the Gospel According to John. We sing hymns that point to the character of new life and offer prayers for all who need new life the most. The sermon, which is rooted in a part of Jesus' high priestly prayer recorded in John 17, explores some ways in which we might seek to pray for the church, following Jesus' example. We are sent forth to live as resurrection people in a Good Friday world, to bring hope into the darkest corners of despair.


