LEADER: Michael and Sophia, do you, as parents, embrace your primary responsibility to nurture Olivia in faith?

PARENTS: *Yes, we do, for we long to pass on our heritage to her.*

LEADER: Do you, the members of First Baptist Church, pledge to work toward creating a nurturing environment for Olivia and all the children God entrusts to our care?

PEOPLE: **Yes, we do, for these children belong to us as well.**

LEADER: Then may God be with us and help us.

ALL: **Amen.**

ABOUT OUR WORSHIP: Today is Pentecost, the day when the Spirit is poured out upon the faithful in Jerusalem. It is a day with previous significance in Judaism, Shavuot, The Feast of Weeks, which commemorates the giving of the law to Moses at Mount Sinai. It is a High Holy Day in the Christian year, a day when we celebrate the gift of the Spirit and the birth of the church. Thus, the hymns and anthems offer joyful thanks to God for these gifts of grace. The stoles we wear are red, a symbol of the tongues of fire that allow people to hear the Gospel in different languages (a reality we will experience in worship today), and the descending dove on each stole represents the Spirit who is given to the church. The streamers offer a visual element to our celebration, as we seek to offer praise to God with all our being. The sermon, which is rooted in the reading from Acts 2, explores the meaning behind all the excitement. We conclude the service with one of the most exciting rituals of our faith, the dedication of a child.
