ABOUT OUR WORSHIP

Today is the Fifth Sunday of Easter, a season in which we celebrate the good news of resurrection and reflect upon its significance for our lives and world. We are called to worship by the closing words of Psalm 22, a psalm that begins with feelings of frustration and forsakenness but ends with words of praise and celebration, movement that foreshadows Jesus' experience of death and resurrection. The first hymn is rooted in this psalm. The other hymns and anthem are tied to the reading from John and the image of Jesus as the true vine and us as branches called to abide in him. The sermon, which is rooted in this text as well, explores this imagery and its underlying assumption that growth is a central part of the journey of faith. We are sent forth to pursue growth every way that we can, to bear fruit in God's bountiful vineyard.


