## Churchwide Retreat at Caswell in April

If you're looking to build community, strengthen relationships with God and others, and have fun at the beach with all ages of our church, have we got a retreat for you!

During the weekend of April 13-15, we're offering a second intergenerational retreat at Fort Caswell (on Oak Island, NC) to explore the theme of neighboring. We'll focus on the qualities of community that create a welcoming, inviting environment for all as we enjoy small groups, worship, recreation, crafts, morning and evening devotional times on the beach, free time, and meals together.

We have reserved five cottages – Redwine, Riverside A and B, Sand Dune, and Yucca and can accommodate up to 144 people in those five cottages. Sleeping arrangements range from single gender bunk rooms to rooms with double beds to a few rooms with a double bed and bunk. It will be communal living – but that's part of the fun of getting to know each other! Youth and 3<sup>rd</sup> - 5<sup>th</sup> grade children can attend without their parents as long as we have individuals who are dedicated to help chaperone during free times and transitions.

The cost for the weekend (two nights plus four meals) will be \$70/person. This year, we're offering a \$200 maximum to make it more affordable for larger families! Our time together will begin after supper on Friday and will end after worship on Sunday morning.

Space is limited, so please contact Lynn Lingafelt ([llingafelt@fbcraleigh.org](mailto:llingafelt@fbcraleigh.org)) no later than Wednesday, February 21 if you are interested in being a part of this weekend retreat. Private bedrooms will be assigned on a first come, first served basis.

If you want to participate in the retreat but would rather find your own accommodations on Oak Island, the cost will be \$25/person, which covers the cost of meals (three meals on Saturday and breakfast on Sunday) and supplies. Please indicate these wishes when you sign up.

Because we know not everyone will be able to join us at Caswell, we will also have Sunday School and worship at First Baptist on Sunday, April 15.

We hope you can join this time together!

## From the Pastor

We co-hosted the MLK service for state government employees again this year. It was a moving service, as always, but the Governor's staff made a special effort this year to keep the service to about an hour, and that effort was much appreciated by all. I took time to thank those staff members who worked so hard behind the scenes to make the service the smooth-flowing yet well managed experience that it was. In like manner, Sunday morning in worship I noted the extra work Mary Alice Seals did behind the scenes with the Governor's staff and UNC-TV to make sure sound and video concerns were addressed just as thoroughly.

Whenever there is an event of any significance, it is almost always the case that there are many people working diligently behind the scenes to make things go smoothly. Inevitably there are some who must play more visible roles, but without the behind-the-scenes work, those in the more visible roles would not be able to accomplish much. In fact, most of church life is this way. I think of the funeral committee helping assist families in grief, Rodney and Jimmy setting up and tearing down for every service and special event we have, Sunday School teachers and choir members, music and mission leaders, clothing ministry volunteers and youth leaders, committee members and others in no official capacity carrying paintbrushes and hammers, all just going about their work week after week. ## Pictorial Directory Coming Soon

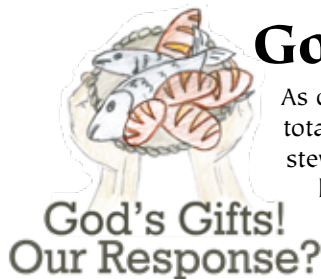

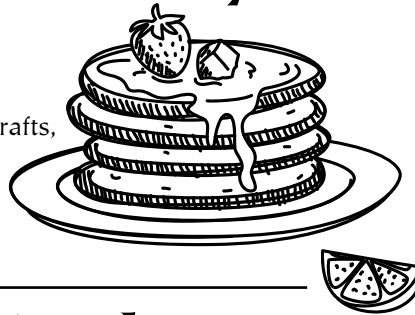
## Go Paperless with First Foundations
