ABOUT OUR WORSHIP

Today is the Third Sunday after Pentecost, part of what is called
Ordinary Time in the Christian year. The liturgical color for this
season is green, a symbol of growth for individuals and the church as
a community. In this season the ministers wear again this year green
stoles that were made last year from materials contributed by church
members and assembled by church members, as guided by Mary
Hauser and Holly Ivel. The stoles reflect the richness of our diverse
community while enhancing our worship of God with visual beauty.
The sermon, the first in a series which focuses on parallels between
ancient Israel's experience and ours, explores the question of where
we place our deepest trust, in God or our own wisdom and strength.
We deepen our trust in God through the celebration of communion,
sing hymns and hear an anthem which express trust in the
faithfulness of God, and pray in faithful trust in God's goodness and
love. We conclude worship today by commissioning youth and
chaperones for their upcoming mission trip, entrusting them and their
labor to God.

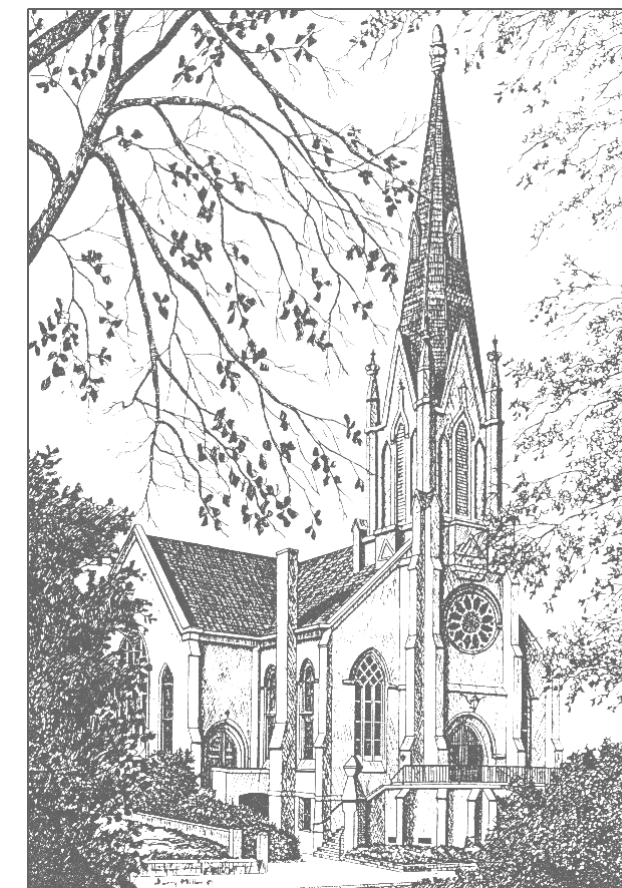
