ABOUT OUR WORSHIP

Today is the Seventeenth Sunday after Pentecost, part of what is called Ordinary Time in the Christian year. We begin with the words of Psalm 19 which invite us to worship the God of all creation and a hymn of praise that allows us to do just that. We listen for God's voice speaking through three readings and lift up prayers for those we love and the world around us, today expressing special concern for all affected by Hurricane Florence and all responding with compassion. The sermon, which is rooted in the reading from Mark 8, offers a reflection on Peter's confession of Jesus as the Messiah. He uses the correct term but does not share Jesus' understanding of what it means. How do we understand the term, what kind of Messiah do we want, what kind of God do we believe in, and what kind of faith does all of this imply? The second two hymns proclaim the kind of faith that is ours, a faith shaped by love in the way of the cross. The anthem expresses our longing to reveal such a faith as we place our lives in God's hands.

TODAY there is no police officer on duty due to Hurricane Florence. Raleigh Police Department Chief Cassandra Deck-Brown cancelled all secondary employment for officers until further notice.


