Vacation Bible School Coming Soon

It's that time of year – time to start planning for Vacation Bible School! It's in the evening this year – July 29 through August 2 – and it's for all ages! Our preschoolers will have self-contained classes with Bible study, crafts, outside time, and music while our gradeschoolers, youth, and adults will have age-grouped Bible study followed by intergenerational electives.

- Making the Japanese-American Cultural Exchange (JACE) its own committee; and
- Technical corrections to the provisions regarding the Social Committee and the Wedding Committee.

From the Pastor

Our facilities assessment process, guided by New City Design and our own Adam Harker, is moving along very well. We had two listening sessions this past Sunday, May 6, and we are currently completing a space utilization questionnaire. If you have not completed one yet, please do so by Sunday, May 13. It is accessible through this link – http://www.surveymonkey.com/r/FBC_Test1 – and on our website. Copies are also available in the church office and can be mailed upon request.

The next step in this process is that we will have a churchwide dialogue, led by a trained facilitator from a firm in Philadelphia, on Sunday, May 20, at 5:30 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall. A meal will be provided for the normal Wednesday night cost (please make a reservation through the customary channels by noon on Thursday, May 17), as well as childcare (please notify Lynn Lingafelt at llingafelt@fbcraleigh.org by Monday, May 14).

There are no preconceived ideas about what we might do with our facilities going forward, and this assessment only involves the Lewis Building, but this kind of assessment is critical to any future considerations. As we continue to discern God's intent for our church and pursue our vision for ministry, we need everyone to participate in the process. Please come and share your ideas, concerns, hopes, and dreams as we chart our future together under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. **CC**

April Conference Highlights

Highlights of the April 25 church conference include:

Mary Nash Rusher, Finance Chair, reported that revenue has outpaced expenses for the year by approximately \$64,000.

Tyson Graves, Properties Committee Chair, thanked Charles Petty and Jerry Dudeck for their work on the pastor's office bathroom and two music suite bathrooms. He also presented three items for approval: new carpeting, replacement of the sanctuary sound system, and new tires for the church vehicles. Adam Harker spoke about the space utilization study.

Holly Ivel, Nominating Chair, presented recommendations for a number of positions.

Lauren Bradley, Constitution and Bylaws Chair, presented proposed bylaws amendments (see related article).

Jen Foster, Minister with Community Search Committee Chair, presented an update on the search.

Dennis Herman and Dawn Raynor, members of the deacon-led Congregational Care team, reported on upcoming work focusing on new members, visitors, membership concerns, spiritual care, daily prayer, and long-term grief.

Ann Rollins spoke about the *ad hoc* Safety Committee which will explore the safety operations of the church, develop safety documents for new systems, and formalize existing processes.

Dr. Chapman reported that the Church Council renamed the clothing ministry fund the "Kibler/Osborne Clothing Ministry Fund" and presented the Church Council's recommendation to fund three small mission projects.
