About our Worship: Today we celebrate Epiphany (technically January 6), the oldest traditional recognition of the incarnation. The name comes from the Greek word *epiphaneia* which means "appearance" or "manifestation" and refers to the manifestation of the Christ to the whole world, beginning with travelers from the East called Magi. Thus, we read the familiar text from Matthew 2, along with texts that point to the meaning of this day. We sing hymns which reflect upon the Magi's journey and celebrate the good news of incarnation. And we consider the implications of this story for our lives—the fact that faith involves a journey for all of us, not simply one moment of decision; and the reality that faith involves risk of some kind for all who seek to honor this special child who is born.


Deacon Ordination will be held on Sunday, January 12, during morning worship.
