About our Worship: Today is Transfiguration Sunday, the day we remember the story about the experience three disciples had on a mountain with Jesus wherein he was transformed and a voice spoke to them from a cloud. It is the last Sunday before Lent begins, a last glimpse of glory before a season of penitence and reflection as we follow Jesus on his journey to the cross. All of today's texts help develop this theme as the reading from Matthew presents one account of the transfiguration, the reading from 2 Peter refers to this very same event, and the reading from Exodus describes a similar mystical encounter with God Moses had on a mountain. The hymns and anthem all point to holy mystery in one way or another, our prayers express a longing for an intimate encounter with God, and each part of this service — from the brief moments of silence to the times of celebration — creates space for us to encounter the Holy. The sermon explores one small detail found near the end of the Gospel reading wherein Jesus instructs Peter, James, and John not to tell anyone about their experience with him on the mountain until after he has been raised from the dead. Like those first disciples, we are often asked to keep secrets for a time and then allowed to share them. How we manage these tasks, especially in regard to sacred secrets, is a matter of some significance for our faith and the faith of others.


