About our Worship: Today is the Second Sunday in Lent, a season of penitence and reflection as we follow Jesus on the way to the cross. We continue with times of confession, hymns that point to the nature of discipleship, and an anthem that paints a majestic picture of God's redemptive love. With the verses from John, we begin a series of lengthy Gospel readings that we will hear over the course of several weeks. Each reading, read by multiple voices, tells a story about a significant interaction with Jesus. Each reading creates space for us to reflect upon our interactions with Jesus. Today's sermon provides a first-person exploration of the story about Nicodemus who may be more like us than we think.

Because today is also our church's 208th anniversary (FBC Raleigh was founded on March 8, 1812), we conclude worship with a responsive reading of our Church Covenant trusting that the same God who enriched our past will guide our future.

We are grateful for the musical leadership today of Eddie Abernathy, our guest organist, and Paul Smith, our guest conductor.


