

November 29, 2020 Eleven o'clock

About our Worship: Today is the first Sunday of Advent, a four-week season of preparation for the coming of the Messiah and the beginning of a new Christian year. It is a season of penitence and reflection; thus, we wear purple stoles and include time for confession and assurance. But it is also a season of expectation and preparation, patient waiting for the wondrous new thing God might do among us. So, we light the first Advent candle and sing hymns of hope and fulfillment. All of the texts express a deep longing for something more, but the sermon focuses on the reading from Isaiah in which the people's longing is more than wishful thinking. It is based on God's goodness in the past and the reality that, despite all of the people's struggles and sin, they are still God's handiwork. Might we find hope for our current period of difficult waiting in this ancient story?

The Lighting of the Advent Candle

Reader 1: This is the first Sunday of Advent, the time of preparing for the coming of Christ our Savior. Today our word is *prepare*. There is much to do in the way of preparation. We prepare for Christmas with gift purchases, tree trimming, home decorating, card mailing. We prepare for Christ with prayer, quiet contemplation, acts of service and love, resolutions to become better people than we are now.


Reader 2: The prophet Isaiah describes the time for which we are preparing with these words (Isaiah 2:2-4).

² In days to come the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be raised above the hills; all the nations shall stream to it. ³Many peoples shall come and say, 'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob; that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths.' For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. ⁴ He shall judge between the nations, and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more.

We light the first candle as a sign of our willingness to prepare for the coming of God's reign in Christ.

Reader 1: (Let us pray) Gracious God, help us to prepare not only our homes but also our hearts for the coming of Emmanuel. As we go up the mountain of faith, may we listen for your voice and pay attention to your teachings, that Christ may come to us in the fullness of time to bring us your gift of peace. Amen.



The Call to Confession

In our prayers of confession, we face up to our sin, but not alone. We do it together, knowing that all have sinned and fallen short of the beauty God intended. The Hebrew Bible Isaiah 64:1–9 Michael Hood

¹O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence— ²as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil— to make your name known to your adversaries, so that the nations might tremble at your presence! ³When you did awesome deeds that we did not expect, you came down, the mountains quaked at your presence. ⁴From ages past no one has heard, no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides you, who works for those who wait for him. ⁵You meet those who gladly do right, those who remember you in your ways. But you were angry, and we sinned; because you hid yourself we transgressed.

⁶We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a filthy cloth. We all fade like a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind, take us away. ⁷There is no one who calls on your name, or attempts to take hold of you; for you have hidden your face from us, and have delivered us into the hand of our iniquity. ⁸Yet, O Lord, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand. ⁹Do not be exceedingly angry, O Lord, and do not remember iniquity forever.
