

## THE CHURCH IN WORSHIP FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

December 20, 2020 Eleven o'clock

About our Worship: Today is the fourth Sunday of Advent, a season of reflection and preparation for the coming of the Messiah. We begin, as we have each week in this season, with the lighting of an Advent candle, a sign of hope and expectation. We make time for confession, as we realize we are not fully ready to welcome the Christ into our lives and world. We reflect on Mary's role in this story — a much more arduous and earthy role than we often envision — and ponder what this says to us about our role. And ultimately we sing hymns of praise to the God who works through courageous women like Mary and enters this world in the form of a fragile child. If we understand the message of this season, how can we keep from singing, and from serving the One who envisions all of this for us?

The Trinity Chimes

Three chimes are sounded, awakening us to the presence of God, alerting us to the voice of Christ, centering us in the embrace of the Spirit. As we gather, we present ourselves "as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is our spiritual worship."

#### The Lighting of the Advent Candlet

Reader 1: This is the fourth Sunday of Advent, the time of preparing for the coming of Christ our Savior. Today our words are *Let it be*. We remember that we are called to prepare for Christ's coming, to give witness to our experience and to wait in patient trust for God to act. Now, as Christ's arrival draws near, we are reminded of Mary's words, "Let it be with me according to your word (Luke 1:38)." It is not up to us to dictate how Christ will come into the world, for God continually surprises us. Thus, we pray for God's will to be done.

Reader 2: The prophet Isaiah describes the surprising way God works with these words (Isaiah 7:10–14).

<sup>10</sup> Again the Lord spoke to Ahaz, saying, <sup>11</sup>Ask a sign of the Lord your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven. <sup>12</sup>But Ahaz said, I will not ask, and I will not put the Lord to the test. <sup>13</sup>Then Isaiah said: 'Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary mortals, that you weary my God also? <sup>14</sup>Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Immanuel.'

Reader 1: The first Advent candle burns as a sign of our willingness to prepare for the coming of God's reign in Christ. The second candle reminds us of our calling to give witness to our experience. The third candle offers a symbol of our commitment to wait patiently for God's new age. Today we light the fourth candle as a form of testimony to our resolve to let it be according to God's word.

(Light candle)

Reader 2: (Let us pray) Holy God, our time of waiting is almost over. We have prepared the best we know how and proclaimed the Good News of Christ's coming with our words and deeds. We open our hearts to you now and ask that your will be done in and through our lives. In the name of the Christ who comes, Immanuel, God-With-Us, we pray, amen.

<sup>1</sup>Now when the king was settled in his house, and the Lord had given him rest from all his enemies around him, <sup>2</sup>the king said to the prophet Nathan, "See now, I am living in a house of cedar, but the ark of God stays in a tent." <sup>3</sup>Nathan said to the king, "Go, do all that you have in mind; for the Lord is with you."

<sup>4</sup>But that same night the word of the Lord came to Nathan: <sup>5</sup>Go and tell my servant David: Thus says the Lord: Are you the one to build me a house to live in? <sup>6</sup>I have not lived in a house since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent and a tabernacle. <sup>7</sup>Wherever I have moved about among all the people of Israel, did I ever speak a word with any of the tribal leaders of Israel, whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, saying, "Why have you not built me a house of cedar?" <sup>8</sup>Now therefore thus you shall say to my servant David: Thus says the Lord of hosts: I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep to be prince over my people Israel; <sup>9</sup>and I have been with you wherever you went, and have cut off all your enemies from before you; and I will make for you a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth. <sup>10</sup>And I will appoint a place for my people Israel and will plant them, so that they may live in their own place, and be disturbed no more; and evildoers shall afflict them no more, as formerly, <sup>11</sup>from the time that I appointed judges over my people Israel; and I will give you rest from all your enemies. Moreover the Lord declares to you that the Lord will make you a house. <sup>16</sup>Your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me; your throne shall be established forever.

The Lord's Prayer


Our Father,
