Reader 1: Our time of waiting is over now. Our days of preparation are completed. Christmas is here. What has not been done will have to be left undone. We have witnessed to this very night, this very hour, and we hope that the world has heard the Good News. There are many ways to summarize God's love for the world, but the prophet Isaiah puts it this way (Isaiah 9:2–4, 6–7). Reader 2:

²The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined. ³You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder. ⁴For the yoke of their burden, and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. ⁶For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. ⁷His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his kingdom. He will establish and uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time onwards and for evermore. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will do this.

Reader 1: Our circle of Advent candles is lit. This evening we light the central candle, the Christ candle, which reminds us that Christ is the light of the world, the center of our lives and the source of hope for the whole world. Christ is born. Praise God!

Reader 2: (Let us pray) Holy God, we are grateful that the time of waiting and preparing is over and that the light of Christ shines so clearly tonight. May our spirits be lifted and our hearts rejoice, for the world will never be the same again. Grace and truth have come to set us free from all that binds us, and we are grateful beyond the capacity of words to express, amen!

On this special night of nights, we are sharing in a sacred story, and celebrating community with gifts of bread and wine. But we have also been reminded that as we gather, if our sister or brother has anything against us we must leave our gifts and first cleanse our hands for the giving. Let us then pray that God will create a clean heart in us.

(Silence)

LEADER: Creating Source of Life, you know what we need without our words. Hear our prayers

and hear also our silence. Give us strength. Grant us those things we cannot or dare not voice, in the name of the Christ who comes and in the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen.


⁸In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: ¹¹to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. ¹²This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." ¹³And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, ¹⁴"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

¹⁵When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." ¹⁶So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. ¹⁷When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; ¹⁸and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. ¹⁹But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. ²⁰The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.
