March 28, 2021 Eleven o'clock

About our Worship: Today is Palm Sunday, the day we remember Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. There is tension between the joy of this day and the shadow that is cast upon it by the cross that is sure to come. Thus, we begin with images of children bringing palms forward and the singing of "Hosanna, Loud Hosanna" but end by singing "O Sacred Head, Now Wounded." The sermon explores the question of why Jesus even allows this day to happen when it will only irritate Roman authorities and could risk confusing his followers. While we might not be able to answer this question, simply asking it creates space to explore many implications of this day for us, which is a central task not just with Palm Sunday but all of Holy Week. We recall what happened and then ponder what it means for us.
