

About our Worship: Today is the third Sunday after Pentecost, a season where we celebrate the Spirit's movement in the Church and broader world. We continue to gather as a congregation that is partially together, and we trust that God's communal presence will meet us wherever we find ourselves. We are delighted to welcome back the choir as they lead us in worship for the first time in fifteen months. In today's sermon, we'll hear a familiar, challenging parable that Jesus used to describe the kingdom of God. As we consider the mustard seed approach to faith, how does this change the way we view our responsibility in this upside-down kingdom? If we consider the unleashed, unhinged nature of the Spirit, we'll soon realize that this kind of garden cannot be contained to our own response or understanding. The celebration of communion reminds us that the act of sharing the bread and the cup binds us together as a human family where all are cherished, welcomed, and included. If you are joining us virtually, we ask that you prepare the elements of communion at home so that you are able to participate in this celebration.

²²Thus says the Lord God: I myself will take a sprig from the lofty top of a cedar; I will set it out. I will break off a tender one from the topmost of its young twigs; I myself will plant it on a high and lofty mountain. ²³On the mountain height of Israel I will plant it, in order that it may produce boughs and bear fruit, and become a noble cedar. Under it every kind of bird will live; in the shade of its branches will nest winged creatures of every kind. ²⁴All the trees of the field shall know that I am the Lord. I bring low the high tree, I make high the low tree; I dry up the green tree and make the dry tree flourish. I the Lord have spoken; I will accomplish it.

LEADER: This is the Word of the Lord.

PEOPLE: Thanks be to God.

The Christian Testament 2 Corinthians 5:6–17

⁶So we are always confident; even though we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord— ⁷for we walk by faith, not by sight. ⁸Yes, we do have confidence, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord. ⁹So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him. ¹⁰For all of us must appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense for what has been done in the body, whether good or evil. ¹¹Therefore, knowing the fear of the Lord, we try to persuade others; but we ourselves are well known to God, and I hope that we are also well known to your consciences.

¹²We are not commending ourselves to you again, but giving you an opportunity to boast about us, so that you may be able to answer those who boast in outward appearance and not in the heart. ¹³For if we are beside ourselves, it is for God; if we are in our right mind, it is for you. ¹⁴For the love of Christ urges us on, because we are convinced that one has died for all; therefore all have died. ¹⁵And he died for all, so that those who live might live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised for them.

¹⁶From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. ¹⁷So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!

LEADER: This is the Gospel of Christ.

PEOPLE: Praise be to you, O Christ.

The Gospel Mark 4:26–34


²⁶He also said, "The kingdom of God is as if someone would scatter seed on the ground, ²⁷and would sleep and rise night and day, and the seed would sprout and grow, he does not know how. ²⁸The earth produces of itself, first the stalk, then the head, then the full grain in the head. ²⁹But when the grain is ripe, at once he goes in with his sickle, because the harvest has come."

³⁰He also said, "With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable will we use for it? ³¹It is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; ³²yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade."

³³With many such parables he spoke the word to them, as they were able to hear it; ³⁴he did not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything in private to his disciples.
