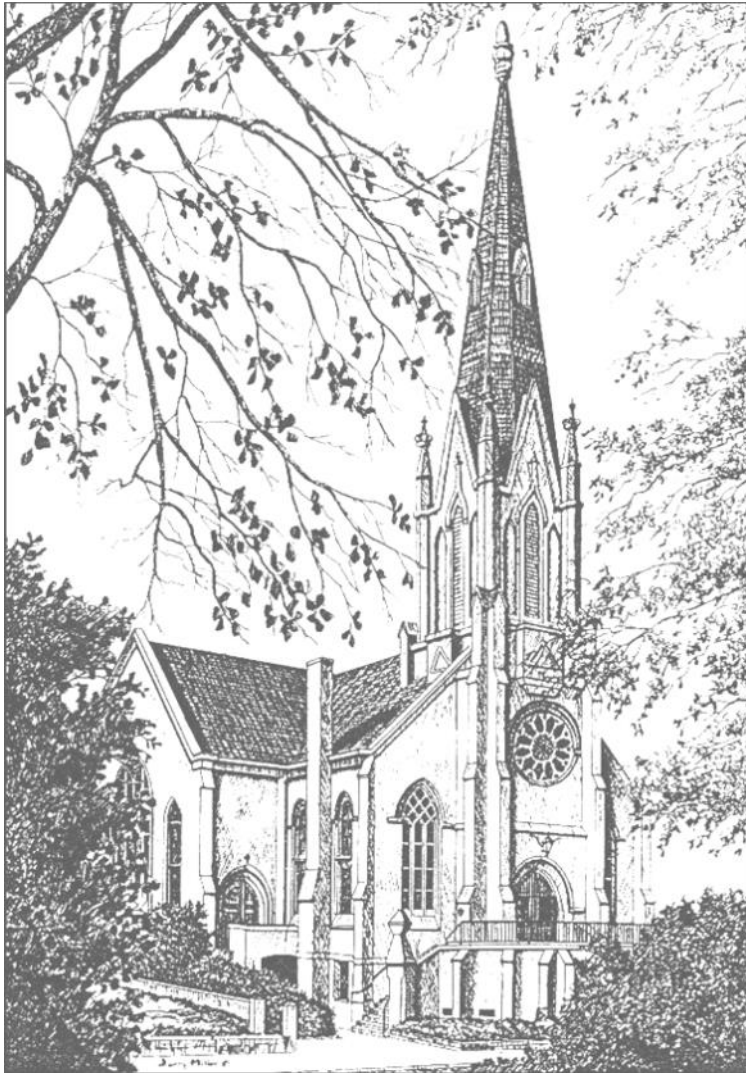

About our Worship: We begin worship on this Twelfth Sunday after Pentecost with baptism, a key beginning place of blessing and commitment on the Christian journey. Other elements in the service address other aspects of the journey – acts of praise and thanksgiving, prayers of petition and intercession, a calling to service and love. The sermon, which is based on the reading from Hebrews, examines some basic habits of Christian faith that are always appropriate, even in desperate times – things like hospitality and mutual love, concern for the marginalized and sharing with others, personal integrity and faithfulness to God. We worship God not only through our words and songs of praise, but also through our faithful pursuit of these habits which the author of Hebrews says are pleasing to God.

The Invitation to the Ritual (responsive)¹

LEADER: At the creation God’s Spirit swept over the surface of the waters. God divided the waters into sky and sea and created the dry land. God called forth light and brought life from the face of the deep.

PEOPLE: God our creator makes all things new: Give God thanks and praise.

LEADER: God brought Noah, his family, and all kinds of creatures through the waters of the flood to live in faithfulness and peace. The bow in the clouds is the sign of the covenant of peace that God has made with the earth and every living being.

PEOPLE: God’s steadfast love endures forever: Give God thanks and praise.

LEADER: By a strong east wind, the Lord drove back the waters of the sea, and the Hebrew slaves of Pharaoh crossed the sea on dry land. God’s awesome might brings God’s people through the waters to a new life of freedom.

PEOPLE: God has given us a marvelous victory: Give God thanks and praise.

LEADER: John baptized Jesus in the waters of the Jordan. When Jesus came up from the river, he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and heard a voice from heaven saying, “This is my Son, the Beloved.”

PEOPLE: God sends Jesus, the anointed One, to preach peace: Give God thanks and praise.

LEADER: In the waters of baptism we are buried with Christ, and as Christ was raised from the dead, so we will rise with Christ and walk with him in newness of life.

PEOPLE: By Jesus’ death and resurrection we are given life: Give God thanks and praise.

Jeremiah 2:4–13

⁴Hear the word of the Lord, O house of Jacob, and all the families of the house of Israel. ⁵Thus says the Lord: What wrong did your ancestors find in me that they went far from me, and went after worthless things, and became worthless themselves? ⁶They did not say, "Where is the Lord who brought us up from the land of Egypt, who led us in the wilderness, in a land of deserts and pits, in a land of drought and deep darkness, in a land that no one passes through, where no one lives?" ⁷I brought you into a plentiful land to eat its fruits and its good things. But when you entered you defiled my land, and made my heritage an abomination. ⁸The priests did not say, "Where is the Lord?" Those who handle the law did not know me; the rulers transgressed against me; the prophets prophesied by Baal, and went after things that do not profit.

⁹Therefore once more I accuse you, says the Lord, and I accuse your children's children. ¹⁰Cross to the coasts of Cyprus and look, send to Kedar and examine with care; see if there has ever been such a thing. ¹¹Has a nation changed its gods, even though they are no gods? But my people have changed their glory for something that does not profit. ¹²Be appalled, O heavens, at this, be shocked, be utterly desolate, says the Lord, ¹³for my people have committed two evils: they have forsaken me, the fountain of living water, and dug out cisterns for themselves, cracked cisterns that can hold no water.

LEADER: This is the Word of the Lord.

PEOPLE: **Thanks be to God.**

The Christian Testament

Hebrews 13:1–8, 15–16

¹Let mutual love continue. ²Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it. ³Remember those who are in prison, as though you were in prison with them; those who are being tortured, as though you yourselves were being tortured. ⁴Let marriage be held in honor by all, and let the marriage bed be kept undefiled; for God will judge fornicators and adulterers. ⁵Keep your lives free from the love of money, and be content with what you have; for he has said, "I will never leave you or forsake you." ⁶So we can say with confidence, "The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can anyone do to me?" ⁷Remember your leaders, those who spoke the word of God to you; consider the outcome of their way of life, and imitate their faith. ⁸Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.

¹⁵Through him, then, let us continually offer a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that confess his name. ¹⁶Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.

PEOPLE: **Thanks be to God.**

¹On one occasion when Jesus was going to the house of a leader of the Pharisees to eat a meal on the sabbath, they were watching him closely. ⁷When he noticed how the guests chose the places of honor, he told them a parable. ⁸“When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not sit down at the place of honor, in case someone more distinguished than you has been invited by your host; ⁹and the host who invited both of you may come and say to you, ‘Give this person your place,’ and then in disgrace you would start to take the lowest place. ¹⁰But when you are invited, go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he may say to you, ‘Friend, move up higher’; then you will be honored in the presence of all who sit at the table with you. ¹¹For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.” ¹²He said also to the one who had invited him, “When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbors, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. ¹³But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. ¹⁴And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.”
