

The lectionary reading from 2 Timothy provides a wonderful framework for our practice, as Paul counsels Timothy on the need for lifelong learning and the centrality of scripture in the process. Today's service as a whole is shaped by this central theme.

help us out when we're hurt or sad or just want to play.


PEOPLE: God's love never fails.



¹In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: ²proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favorable or unfavorable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching. ³For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires, ⁴and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. ⁵As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully.
