## THE CHURCH IN WORSHIP PALM SUNDAY

April 2, 2023 Eleven o'clock

About our Worship: Today is Palm Sunday, the day we remember Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, and the beginning of Holy Week. It always involves a mixture of emotions as we remember what lies ahead for Jesus. The music and liturgy reflect the complexity of the day as we sing praises to Christ and wave palms in the air yet also confess sin and ponder our role in the events of this week. The sermon explores our desire to find a different outcome for this story, one in which Jesus does not have to die, but we ultimately acknowledge the inevitability of this outcome because of who we are and who Jesus is. The good news is that this story does not end with Palm Sunday nor does it end with Good Friday. We look to Easter, even as we approach the cross, and we see everything — in the story and in our lives — through the lens of the resurrection.


#### The Trinity Chimes



The Gospel Matthew 21:1–11

<sup>1</sup>When they had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, <sup>2</sup>saying to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. <sup>3</sup>If anyone says anything to you, just say this, 'The Lord needs them.'
