DAY MISSIONS FUND UPDATE AND INVITATION

For a number of years, the Day Missions Fund, administered by the church council, has helped facilitate hands-on missions work around the world and in our own community.

For the fiscal year September 1, 2021–August 31, 2022, the council approved \$5,000 for emergency help in Ukraine and \$5,000 for a Sharefish project in Honduras.

For the fiscal year September 1, 2022–August 31, 2023, the council has approved \$750 for CROP Walk, \$1,204 for Project Ruth food boxes (for relief in Ukraine), \$3,500 for house construction in Honduras through Monte de Horeb Ministries, \$5,000 for the renovation of the former First Presbyterian Church of Ahoskie so that it can function as a community ministry center, and \$8,000 for a building project in El Carrizo, Honduras, through Sharefish.

This summer, the council will begin receiving requests for the fiscal year September 1, 2023–August 31, 2024. An application is attached here and can be submitted to

Dr. Chapman (<u>cchapman@fbcraleigh.org</u>) or brought to the church office. Guidelines for the fund are also attached to this newsletter.

We are grateful for those who envisioned this fund and for all who have contributed to it. It is a sign of our church's commitment to missions involvement and a means through which to live it out faithfully. We encourage any member or group of people in the church considering a mission project to apply for help from this fund.



Policies to Guide the Use of the Missions Endowment Fund ("Day Missions Fund")

Section 6:3 of the FBC Bylaws defines the overarching purpose of the Missions Endowment Fund and gives the Church Council responsibility for approving expenditures of less than \$10,000 and recommending expenditures of \$10,000 or more for approval by the church conference. Section 5:8a(4) charges the Church Council with the responsibility of developing policies with respect to specific expenditures and administration of the Fund to be approved by the church conference. The Council recommends the following policies.

- 1. Priority will be given to help fund missions endeavors which involve members of the FBC family in hands-on work beyond the Raleigh metropolitan area. Funding will be considered for supplies and travel costs.
- 2. After needs beyond the Raleigh area are addressed, if additional funds are available, hands-on missions work in the Raleigh area done by members of the FBC family will be considered for funding.
- 3. Priority will be given to efforts not already funded or not adequately funded by the FBC budget and annual missions offerings.
- 4. The Church Council will begin receiving requests on July 1 of each year for mission work to be done in the twelve months beginning on September 1 of that year and ending on August 31 of the following year. While requests may be submitted throughout the year, the Council will give priority to requests received in the month of July.
- 5. In any given year (defined as September 1 through August 31) the Council may approve the disbursal of an amount not to exceed the average of the market value of the funds and investments in the Day Missions Fund at the beginning of each of the previous sixteen quarters, multiplied by 4% (revised at church conference on February 27, 2019 upon recommendation by the finance committee). Unused available funds may be carried over to the following year to address specific needs as approved by the Church Council.
- 6. The Council will give an annual report at a church conference on how the Fund has been used in the previous year, reminding members of the Fund's purpose and inviting requests for the following year.
