

November 5, 2023 Eleven o'clock

About our Worship: For a number of years, we have celebrated All Saints Day on November 1, if it falls on a Sunday, or on the first Sunday after that day, if it does not. It is an ancient Christian celebration dating back at least to the fifth century C.E., a day when we remember all the saints of the church universal, especially the members of this church family who have preceded us into eternity in the last year. As a part of this recognition and celebration, we sing hymns that proclaim eternal hope, we read texts that assure us of our place in God's realm, we remember those we have lost in the past year, and because the status of the annual Holiday Service of Hope and Remembrance this year is uncertain, we also list the names of extended family members we have lost this past year and hold all who grieve in our hearts not just today but throughout the holiday season. The prayer of remembrance begins our time of recognition, the sermon explores the nature of genuine sainthood as something we are all called to pursue, and our celebration of communion enables us to catch a glimpse of eternity, to taste and see that both God and life are good.


Holy Father, Holy Son, Holy Spirit: three we name you, though in essence only one; undivided God we claim you, and adoring bend the knee while we praise the mystery.
