

# THE CHURCH IN WORSHIP BAPTISM OF THE LORD

January 7, 2024 Eleven o'clock

About our Worship: Today is Baptism of the Lord on the Christian calendar, part of an ancient tradition celebrating Christ's beginning which includes his birth, his baptism, and his first sign or miracle (changing water into wine at Cana, as recorded in John 2). The reading from Genesis 1 locates the new acts of creation God will bring about in the ministry of Jesus in the context of God's first act of creation. We sing praise to this God of new beginnings, and we pray for a world that needs new possibilities. The sermon explores the central text for today, the story of Jesus' baptism. Though familiar to us, it is a jarring story for its first readers, as a Messiah willingly chooses to embrace a humble ritual like everyone else. It is an early sign of what kind of Messiah he will be and thus what kind of calling we have in following him.
