

About our Worship: Today is the Fifth Sunday after Pentecost, a season in which we reflect on our calling to grow as individuals and as a community of faith. Thus, we wear our green community stoles, assembled by church members using materials contributed by church members. The color green provides a symbol of growth, and these particular stoles offer a sign of who we are as a community, one where each of us shapes who we are together. The nature of Christian community is the focus of this service as we explore the reading from 2 Corinthians in which the Apostle Paul reflects upon his relationship with the Church in Corinth, lift up prayers for the beloved community, and sing praises to the God whose nature and calling is love.

LEADER: This is the Word of the Lord.


PEOPLE: Thanks be to God.
