

About our Worship: Today is Baptism of the Lord in the Christian year, a central story in the Epiphany collection of beginning stories, and the day we remember Jesus' baptism and consider its implications for our lives. The service music, prayers, and liturgy are filled with images of water and transformation, as we are baptized into not only water but an entirely new way of justice and love. The sermon reflects on the place of baptism in the contemporary church — what this says about our view of faith in general, and what might be at stake in a recovery of the original value of the sacred ritual. In baptism, we follow Jesus in a distinctive way of life, and we receive a blessing that is like no other.

During January, our program will be a Bible-study series led by Dr. Judy Yakes Siker: Women in Early Christianity: Stories You've Never Heard. Recent scholarship has given us new and intriguing tales about a variety of early Christian women (e.g., Thecla, Perpetua, Felicitas) whose stories are not contained in the New Testament. Join us on January 15 and 22 as we continue to explore some of these stories and expand our understanding of the development of Christianity and the roles of women in the early church. Dr. Siker, a graduate of Meredith College with a Ph.D. from UNC-Chapel Hill, is an ordained minister and serves as a parish associate at White Memorial Presbyterian Church.
